Firle School RE days

We will now be teaching RE across a whole day each term, rather than in one lesson a week. Each class will follow the curriculum as before, so that there will be a different focus in each class. This approach will provide opportunities for children to immerse themselves in their learning over a sustained period, and to continue to enjoy RE through the creative subjects eg drama and art. In addition to this we will be sharing whole school festival afternoons, exploring celebrations across different faiths and cultures.

Our first RE day will be on **Wednesday 5th October**, followed by an afternoon exploring the Jewish festival Sukkot on **Friday 21st October**
