Stand up for East Sussex!

You may have already be aware that East Sussex County Council has launched a fairer funding campaign – Stand Up For East Sussex.

They're asking residents and businesses to sign a petition to the Prime Minister which calls for an urgent rethink on the resources the county receives. In 2014 Ofsted rated 64 per cent of primary schools in East Sussex as good or outstanding. In 2017 it's 91 per cent and we want the Government to give us a long-term funding plan to maintain that success. The campaign also highlights how adult social care, transport, jobs and the economy would benefit from a fairer funding deal.

Maths Passports Update

Our Maths Passport work is becoming well established as part of our teaching and learning at Firle. The children will bring an updated copy of their objectives home each week after their teacher has assessed them in class. The teacher will date the objective if enough evidence has been seen to indicate that the child is secure. Each objective needs to be dated 3 times by the teacher before we move the children on, so please be aware that your child may have the same objectives to work on over a few weeks. This allows consolidation to take place and the knowledge to then be held in the long term memory of the children! Each passport is designed to be worked on over a period of at least two months, so the children must not be rushed through the process. When the children have met all the objectives, they will complete a 'Passport



Control Test' where they demonstrate they are secure with the range of objectives on that passport. From South America onwards, these are timed tests so it is important the children are practising rapid recall of their objectives. Your child's class teacher will send home the new passport when it is issued. Please work with your children on the objectives identified by the class teacher. We will also be working on the objectives through the week, in class. Thank you for the support given so far. It is making a real difference to the children and we are already seeing huge improvements in mental maths and rapid recall of number facts!
